Dear Sir /Madam

My name is Jamie Heron, I am the Estates Officer for Sibelco, Devon. I am writing to you regarding the increasing traffic volumes using the narrow bridge over the river Teign below Clay Lane quarry. This route effectively links the B3193 (Clay Pitts Way) with the A38 and the B3344. Due in part to the increasing numbers of houses in the local area the problem is getting worse year on year. I appreciate that the bridge was built at a time when traffic numbers were minimal and the cost/logistics of putting in a new bridge substantial, but this is now becoming a safety issue with drivers tailgating to avoid having to wait for people coming the other way.

We at Sibelco use the bridge on a regular basis to get from Clay Lane and Chudleigh Knighton Quarries to Preston Manor/ East Golds and appreciate that this can also create issues. However, after talking to a number of people in the area and some recent accidents occurring, it is now felt that something must be done, namely traffic lights being put in place.

I hope Devon County Council can address this issue and look forward to hearing from you.

## Dear Tegan

#### Clay Lane Bridge, Chudleigh Knighton

The Parish Council considered the issues relating to Clay Lane Bridge at its November meeting and it has asked me to bring to your attention the continue problems caused by traffic volumes and request that a traffic count is undertaken with a view to installing "on demand" traffic lights.

During busy periods such as "rush hour" the situation becomes unbearable with traffic built up on both sides of the bridge and gridlocks reached as vehicles remain stationary on the top of the bridge and unable (or unwilling) to give way. With the ever-increasing volumes of traffic resulting from significant housing developments (ongoing and proposed) in Bovey Tracey, Kingsteignton and Chudleigh Knighton the situation will only get worse.

The Devon County Council Bridge Team have said in the past that it is unlikely that any proposed scheme to reduce or manage traffic levels would be considered a priority when evaluated against other sites which have a demonstrable safety issue. However, as you are aware, there have been a number of incidents in the last twelve months when the bridge has been hit and repairs have been required – on these occasions temporary traffic lights have been used and resolved the traffic problems.

The Parish Council understands that Devon County Council has a finite budget and must prioritise its resources; however, it does not accept that a solution to a real traffic problem should only be put in place if there have been casualties. The Parish Council urges Devon County Council Highways to undertake a traffic count to quantify the problem and the need for traffic lights before there are casualties and in order to resolve the issue of traffic congestion. The Parish Council understands that Teignbridge District Council received a substantial sum in Community Infrastructure Levy [CIL] from the Bradley Bends development in Bovey Tracey and given that a

large proportion of the traffic using Clay Lane Bridge will be travelling to/from Bovey Tracey it would not seem unreasonable for a proportion of that CIL to be used as a contribution towards the traffic lights – I am copying this email to Ros Eastman at Teignbridge District Council in respect of this point.

Tegan, I know that you will need to refer this matter to the Bridge Team but the Parish Council would very much appreciate your support in trying to resolve this issue.
