We want to hear your view on our proposed changes to routes 70/77, 13 and 88.

New housing developments and changing travel patterns means we have an opportunity to review these services to ensure they meet your current and future travel needs.

Below, you will find details of our proposals for each of the affected services. We will be adding draft timetables for route 13 and the combined route 70/77/88 shortly.

We are particularly interested in finding out the following:

- Where residents of Highweek, Mile End and Buckland would like to travel to
- Are there any other links we should be incorporating?

Any changes to our timetables would take effect from 8 July (route 88) and 22 July (routes 13, 70/77).

# Route 13: Kingsteignton - Newton Abbot - Aller Brake - The Willows - Torbay Hospital - Marldon - Paignton - South Devon College - Brixham

We would like to make significant improvements to both the route and timetable.

We propose extending the route to start in Kingsteignton, slightly ahead of Hop2. This will provide additional capacity at the busiest times of day.

For journeys from Newton Abbot towards Aller, we propose serving Exeter Road instead of the train station. This is because Exeter Road has a high density of housing but does not currently have a regular bus service and we have a number of other routes that provide better, more frequent links to the train station.

We also propose amending the route between Brixham, Paignton and Torbay Hospital to restore many of links previously provided by Local Link route 67. Buses between Brixham and South Devon College would continue to run on their existing route after which, instead of Foxhole Road, they would serve Waterleat Avenue, Colley End Road, Paignton Bus Station and Marldon Road. Customers who want to travel to Foxhole can connect onto the 'Fox' at Colley End Road and Marldon Road.

We propose to coordinate Brixham departure times with our 18A service, moving the bus stop from Bolton Street to Bank Lane so buses stop right next to each other to create a really easy

connection.

Finally, buses would run hourly throughout the day instead of every 2 hours and we would keep the current variations for particular school and college flows.

#### Route 88: Newton Abbot - Ashburton - Totnes

In 2013 the frequency between Newton Abbot and Ashburton was increased to every 30 minutes. This was supported through funding generated by the Hele Park development. The funding will cease in July and, unfortunately, as we have not seen a significant increase in passenger numbers to maintain a half hourly frequency, the service will revert to an hourly frequency from 8 July.

From 22 July, we propose to incorporate the 70/77 route into the 88 to create new links to Newton Abbot Station and a cross-town service that would run every 30 minutes between Buckland and Mile End.

#### Hop2, Hop12, 39, X64

No changes are proposed.
