Kings Boxing Academy - We at Kings boxing Academy have worked hard to provide a good community gym for young people combined with my total commitment and expert tuition.

We have been out competing all around Devon, to date my boxers are unbeaten which speaks for itself.

Our request for elector funding will support this community gym and assist with paying for better toilet facilities and safer sanitary conditions for our users. We have done well to make repairs and continue to keep the gym ship-tight but we need to have better conditions for those using and visiting.

We also wish to put forward an idea for a minibus for the community, to use for sporting and community transport. We think this would benefit a few clubs in the area especially those who travel to away competition s or contest such as us, those using or needing this can contribute to upkeep, insurance and tax etc.

We would like to use this email to kindly ask to be considered for some funding please.

Dear Councillors,

I am writing to apply to the Elector Fund on behalf of the Youth Centre and KYC Youth Club for a grant to help pay the cost of repairs to the sloping roof above the main area of the Youth Centre and on the flat roof.

The Youth Centre is a charity run by a small group of residents for the benefit of people of all ages in Kingsteignton and the wider area. It is dependent on grants, youth club subs, and revenue raised from private hire. The land and building are owned by the Town Council which holds the property in trust for the benefit of the young people in the area. The facilities are used by private hirers of all ages for various activities including sports, social gatherings and children's parties. Young people aged 8 -17 years attend our youth club sessions three evenings a week and Asperations, a local club and peer support group for children with special needs and their families, meets weekly in the Youth Centre.

Problems with the physical structure of the Youth Centre have been much more extensive than was anticipated when the building was re-opened by the members of the Town Council working party in May 2015, and these issues have had a direct impact on bookings by private hirers. In June 2017 we lost a weekly booking by an agency running a new social club for disabled and elderly people and their carers because the roof was leaking in the main seating area.

Roof leaks in the lounge and IT area have caused unsightly damage to the ceiling in two places. Work needed to fix these will cost £300 ex. The flat roof area above the entrance, lobby and office is developing problems where the felt has thinned due to poor workmanship in the past and we have received a quote for £450 ex. to address this problem.

Repairs to the building's roof are now essential and will help the charity maintain a sound structure on behalf of the Town Council as the property owner.
