VM77/2021 Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme – to discuss letter from resident (attached)

My name is .., I am in year 9 and I chose to do the bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme because I like expeditions and I thought it would be an interesting challenge. The DofE award scheme is made up of four parts – volunteering, physical challenge, skill challenge and an expedition. I chose to do litter picking for the volunteering section of the award because I didn't think that I would be able to volunteer in charity shops or organised situations during any lockdowns. I was able to do litter picking independently and often went out with my family to do this too.

I mostly litter picked around Kingsteignton and I did this every week for three months. I enjoy getting out and about and I found it rewarding to help to clean up the local environment. It was amazing how much litter I found on the streets and in the hedges. Lots was from people dropping sweet packets, pop bottles, cigarette butts and cans, but there was also quite a lot of old plastic and metal litter that had been slightly buried by vegetation and had not degraded at all. One time I even found a real coy carp had been thrown into a tree! I also noticed that, when litter picking after the bin men had visited, there was recycling litter that had blown out of the bins and down the streets. It made me think how people should carefully pack their recycling boxes to avoid this happening.

In Kingsteignton we are never that far away from the river or the leat. We often found quite a lot of litter next to waterways and of course this means that it could easily float out to sea. I was often

thinking about the dangers that our litter causes for the wildlife. Animals could choke on it, creatures could cut themselves on sharp objects thrown away or get trapped/entangled within plastic packaging.

Doing some research, I discovered that 50% of littered items are cigarette butts which take 12 years to break down and leak cadmium, lead and arsenic into soil and waterways. I also discovered that 62% of England's residents admit to littering. I find this shocking!

Every time I litter picked, I also found dog poo bags in the bushes next to paths. I don't understand why people leave these smelly packages for others to clean up after them.

On the whole I enjoyed the experience of cleaning up my neighbourhood and found it satisfying to have contributed to making Kingsteignton a nicer environment for everybody. So much so that whenever we go out for walks now, we always bring litter pickers!

Subject: Kingsteignton School and HDC community market garden

We are currently planning to start a community organic market garden project, which would be in collaboration with Kingsteignton School and HDC Nursery. Our mission is to grow produce and to sell and donate to the community while creating a rich learning environment for children of all ages. We would like to make the project sustainable and for the children to have the opportunity to learn about where our food comes from and the process from soil to plate and also explore the area of marketing first-hand. Part of the governments road map out of covid is to ensure the children of disadvantaged backgrounds receive a wide wealth of opportunity to thrive and we have funded places in holiday club for these children, they would benefit so much by the use of the garden as would all the children from babies to year 6, older if we can get Teign School envolved with the children studying Childcare or Horticulture and all the children have been deeply effected by the last 12 months the fall out is just starting. The school are keen for the elder generation to become volunteers and now they are getting their vaccinations, welcoming them back into the school to pass on their wisdom to the children and this space would allow for meaningful interaction outside in the fresh air.

I don't know if Kingsteignton enters the national Britain in bloom competition but would be great if we can get the community involved.

We are having a meeting with the school soon to make an action plan to move the project forward, I run the Holiday club from the school so the garden will have attention and use all year round.
