Message from our Mayor—Clir Dave Rollason

I was recently honoured to welcome Lord Clifford who began the very well attended opening ceremony of The Fountain in the heart of Kingsteignton, he gave an informative and entertaining history of the Fountain and Kingsteignton. The refurbished Fountain has high approval from our residents and feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. The work was paid for by developers who have to pay funds into Teignbridge District Council.

Kingsteignton Town Council, in a busy programme has put its share of developers money to good use in projects including; rescuing Leats from their deteriorated state, improvements to access into and across Oakford Lawn; we are currently restoring the Multi Use Games Area and skate ramp at Clifford Park in partnership with the Friends of Clifford Park; in the near future, in addition to grass cutting, we will be initiating a new road warden service to address potholes, weeds, signage, and other related problems in the town.

We have embarked on two major initiatives recently and would very much value support and input from the community. Along with many other local councils Kingsteignton has declared a climate emergency and we are asking people to offer ideas or practical help in getting the message out about the need for an environmentally friendly work place and lifestyle. Secondly the Council is playing a part in helping to address mental health issues and is hosting a roadshow sponsored by the Passage House Hotel on 23rd November in the afternoon in support of our local charity "#DoItForDeaks". We would also welcome your views on becoming a dementia friendly town.

A project to end the stigma around mental health and suicide

The Fountain ~ Officially Re-Opened By Lord Clifford



Lord Clifford with scissors in hand, accompanied by Michael Fearn and Mayor, Councillor Dave Rollason joyfully watched the gold ribbon fly across the pavers after declaring the Fountain area officially re-open on the beautiful sunny afternoon of Saturday 24th August, 2019 as invited guests and residents gathered to witness the event!



THE FOUNTAIN OPENING continued...

Town Crier, Mrs Jackie Edwards, rang her bell to gain silence amongst the crowds and told of how proud she was to be stood representing the town. Jackie was accompanied by her consort Mr John Hart as she handed over to Mayor, Cllr Dave Rollason.



Cllr Rollason commenced his speech by saying "Thank you Jackie, as ever you set the scene perfectly". He then continued by explaining that the regeneration has been a long drawn out but worthwhile project, which over the past few months has drawn attention from the public, some negative, but since completion and with us all standing here today, a positive vibe and one of gratitude surrounds us!

"I hope future generations who come here to meet and talk or sit and rest a while, will also value and treasure the Fountain and continue to protect it". "I want to thank Hulls Landscapes for their good work and patience as we worked through a number of supply and technical time-consuming glitches, none of their making".

"Thank you also to the staff and members of the Town Council who saw the project through, the Town Council is quite small, and projects have had input from everyone. However, on this occasion there is a special mention for Mrs Michelle Lewis Clarke, Mrs Carol Lakin, former employee Mr John Stacey, Mr Dave Turner and Councillors Peart, Jones and Scagell".

Members of the public are advised that tax payer's money has not funded this project as it has been paid for from the housing developers CIL fund, which has to

be used to improve amenities for the town.

"I am honoured to give a very warm Welcome to Lord Clifford and to say Thank you for coming to open our refurbished Fountain, thank you also to all who are gathered here today to witness the re-opening"

Lord Clifford, the 14th Baron Clifford of Chudleigh, took the stand at the Fountain to thank everybody for attending the opening and thanked Kingsteignton Town Council for inviting him to mark this very proud and special occasion, as he was following in the footsteps of his Ancestor, Lewis 9th Lord Clifford, who had opened the Original Fountain in 1887, which acted as a 'Drinking Trough' for horses passing through Kingsteignton (the largest village in Great Britain at the time, prior to it gaining the 'Town' status in January 2009).

Lord Clifford advised that the 9th Lord Clifford (who had fought alongside General Custer in America), arranged for Ugbrooke water to be piped to the Original Fountain up until the 1960's when the 13th Lord Clifford was experiencing increasing difficulties in repairing the water pipeline and asked the then Kingsteignton Parish Council if they would contribute towards the maintenance costs, which they declined and so he was forced to sever the water supply and it is now supplied by SW Water. Also, in the 1960's Newton Abbot Racecourse was sold by the Clifford Family. However, Lord Clifford continued to speak of the association that the Clifford Family have had with the people of Kingsteignton since the 16th Century and of how proud they are to have made their contribution such as Clifford Park being used for recreational use to benefit the people of the town, which Lord Clifford has recently handed ownership over to the Town Council.

Lord Clifford once again thanked the Town Council for inviting him along to the Fountain Opening and praised Mr Steve Harris for recording the history of Kingsteignton in his book 'Kingsteignton Through Time' published in 2014 and also congratulated Miss Catherine Harris for her continued involvement with the annual Ram Roasting Fair, which the Clifford Family also used to donate the ram and later a deer or two!

At 2:40pm Lord Clifford, assisted by Mr Michael Fearn a former employee at the family home of Ugbrooke Park, took hold of the scissors and officially cut the gold ribbon whilst speaking the words;- "I hereby declare the Fountain officially open and long may everyone in the Town (and visitors) look after the Fountain area and 'God Save the Queen'.

Mayor, Cllr Dave Rollason, then thanked Lord Clifford for performing the official duty of opening the Fountain and invited everybody over to the Kingsteignton Youth Centre for refreshments.
