#### TOWN COUNCIL PAID RESPECTS IN HONOUR OF HM QUEEN ELIZABETH II



In the absence of the Mayor, Councillor Ron Peart and Deputy Mayor, Councillor Beryl Austen, Councillor Bill Thorne paid tribute to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, by conveying his deepest sympathy to the Royal Family as he laid a wreath in her memory on behalf of Kingsteignton Town Council and of the residents of Kingsteignton. He was accompanied by Councillors Ian Burrows and Julie Scagell, Town Clerk Mrs Carol Lakin, Deputy Clerk Mrs Michelle Lewis-Clarke, Communications Officer Mrs Shirley Simmons and Maintenance Officer Mr Dave Turner.

Residents were invited to lay floral tributes at the Cider Press in the grounds of the Council Offices, Community Hall.

The Book of Condolence was available in the foyer of the Community Hall for residents and visitors to sign from Friday 9th to Friday 16th September, as well as providing details of how to sign the online version at Buckingham Palace.

Kingsteignton Town Council followed the protocol for Operation London Bridge, which included the lowering of the Union Jack to half-mast upon the announcement of Her Majesty's death on Thursday 8th September, the veiling of the Council's website, Facebook page and Noticeboards, showing photographs of our late Queen and providing information via our website, Facebook and posters to our residents. Council meetings were cancelled and Council Staff wore sombre clothing during the period of mourning.

The Union Jack was raised on Saturday 9th until Sunday 10th September in honour of the reading of the Principal Proclamation of the new King, Charles III, acceding the throne which was held at St Jame's Palace in London on Saturday and Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast on Sunday. Following this the flag was lowered to half-mast until the day following the funeral of Queen Elizabeth on Monday 19th September.

The front of the Council building was lit in purple throughout the mourning period.



#### CEREMONY OF THE PROCLAMATION TO THE PEOPLE OF THE TEIGNBRIDGE DISTRICT

At 10am on Monday 12th September, Dignitaries, Councillors, Council Staff and local residents gathered at the front of Old Forde House, Newton Abbot for the Ceremony to mark the Proclamation to the local people of Teignbridge of King Charles III's reign.

Chair of Teignbridge District Council, Councillor Charles Nuttall addressed all in attendance:-

"Ladies and Gentlemen. We come together this morning following the passing of our late Sovereign, Queen Elizabeth the Second. Our sadness at this time is shared by people across the globe, as we remember with affection and gratitude the lifetime of service given by our longest-reigning Monarch.

But the basis on which our monarchy is built has ensured that through the centuries the Crown has passed in an unbroken line of succession. Today's ceremony marks the formal Proclamation to the people of the District of Teignbridge of the beginning of our new King's reign.

On Saturday the Accession Council met at St. James's Palace to proclaim our new Sovereign. The flags which had flown at half-mast since The Queen's death were raised briefly to their full height to mark the start of His Majesty's reign.

The Accession Council also made an Order requiring High Sheriffs to cause the Proclamation to be read in the areas of their jurisdiction. The High Sheriff of Devon discharged that duty yesterday and now, with my humble duty, I bring the words of the Proclamation to the residents of the District of Teignbridge."

Kingsteignton Deputy Mayor and District Councillor Beryl Austen, Town and District Councillor Bill Thorne, Kingsteignton Town Clerk Mrs Carol Lakin and Communications Officer Mrs Shirley Simmons attended the Teignbridge District Proclamation held at Old Forde House on Monday 12th September.

All present joined in saying: God save The King and sang the National Anthem.

God save our gracious King!
Long live our noble King!
God save the King!
Send him victorious,
happy and glorious,
long to reign over us,
God save the King.

Whereas it has pleased Almighty God to call to His Mercy our late Sovereign Lady Queen Elizabeth the Second of Blessed and Glorious Memory, by whose Decease the Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is solely and rightfully come to The Prince Charles Philip Arthur George: We, therefore, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm and Members of the House of Commons, together with other members of Her late Majesty's Privy Council and representatives of the Realms and Territories, Aldermen and Citizens of London, and others, do now hereby with one voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart publish and proclaim that The Prince Charles Philip Arthur George is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign of Happy Memory, become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord Charles the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of His other Realms and Territories, King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to whom we do acknowledge all Faith and Obedience with humble Affection; beseeching God by whom Kings and Queens do reign to bless His Majesty with long and happy Years to reign over us.

Above given at St. James's Palace this tenth day of September in the year of Our Lord two thousand and twenty-two.

#### SWIFT EVENT

Saturday 2nd July, Kingsteignton Wild participated in the event held in Newton Abbot to promote the need for helping to encourage Swift's to nest. Remarkably these birds are in flight full-time and only ever land to nest. It is a very short period when they do this.



#### SWIFT BOXES

Kingsteignton Town Council have recently installed six 'Swift 'nesting boxes to the Council Offices/Community Hall building.

We are keen to encourage swifts to nest, although we are aware that this may realistically take up to five years or may never happen at all but smaller species such as blue tits and sparrows may occupy them in the meantime. A call system can help to attract swifts to the boxes and can speed up occupation or we can just be patient and wait for natural colonisation.

#### **BEATING THE BOUND'S 2022**

The ancient traditional event to walk the boundaries of our parish was undertaken by a group of 20 walkers in extreme temperatures over two consecutive Saturdays, 6th and 13th of August. Split into two walks due to the overall length of the Kingsteignton parish boundaries totalling approx.17.2 miles. Prior to each walk having commenced, the Reverend David Goddard of Kingsteignton Community Baptist Church said a prayer for those taking part.



Both walks were led by Cllr Dave Ripping & Mr Rob Bovey, assisted by Cllrs Martin Field, Ian Burrows & Jo Gregson at the rear.

Devon Direct First Aiders joined the walk to ensure that everybody was kept safe.

Walkers acknowledged each boundary stone on route, before moving on towards the next one.

At the end of the first day, a couple of people were presented with their medals and certificates, as they were unable to take part on the second walk.

To mark the end of the 2022 event, on the afternoon of Saturday 13th August, Mayor Councillor Ron Peart and his wife Mayoress Mrs June Peart welcomed everybody as they returned to the Passage House Inn car park on the bank of the River Teign. It was here that they presented all participants with a 'Beating the Bounds 2022 Medal and Certificate'.

Mayor Councillor Ron Peart said, "I would like to thank all who took part, land owners who gave permission to cross their land, Councillors who led the walk, medics who attended and Council Staff who helped to organise this special event. My wife and I did this walk 8 years ago, 17.2 miles over two days and decided once was enough!"


