KTC's DECLARATION ON CLIMATE EMERGENCY CRISIS

Kingsteignton Town Council — DECLARES CLIMATE EMERGENCY

Climate Change impacts on all aspects of modern life. Kingsteignton Town Council (KTC) has joined thousands of other councils in the UK in declaring a Climate Emergency. Kingsteignton is a small council with limited powers. Therefore, we are focussing our attention in the areas most likely to gain most traction.

The Councils own activities impact on climate change through our carbon footprint. KTC has already undertaken a range of actions to reduce or offset our own carbon footprint. These include the following:-

Single Use Plastics	Banning single use on all Council premises where possible
Paperless Office	Moving towards paperless administration and meetings Developing the new KTC website to make information easily accessible online
Solar Panels	Commissioning solar panels to be fitted on the KTC Community Hall
Electric Vehicles	Installing electrical vehicle charging points on council premises Planning to replace diesel vans with electric vehicles when the current vehicles reach the end of their serviceable life
Biodiversity	Increasing biodiversity on verges and open spaces maintained by KTC by introducing 'No Mow Zones' adopting the widely recognised cut-less – cut-later approach to verge maintenance
Tree Planting	To align with regional and national initiatives, KTC are: Planning large scale tree-planting on Council and partner-owned land Sourcing and providing trees for members of the public to plant themselves
Local Produce	Investigating opportunities for additional allotments and wild-forage planting

Alongside these actions that are within council influence, KTC are lobbying and campaigning for regional and national organisations to play their part too. These include the following:-

Non-motorised Traffic	Discussions with Devon County Council for options to improve cycling and pedestrian safety in the Town. These include:- Creation of additional footpaths and cycle-paths where possible Adoption of 20mph speed limits - especially around schools
Built Environment	KTC is not a planning authority but we do make recommendations to Teignbridge District Council on planning applications. These recommendations now include the requirement for:- New Buildings to be low carbon, energy and water efficient New Developments to include rainwater catchment management best practise and community gardens
Ethical Sourcing	Encouraging and favouring suppliers of goods and services to adopt best practice. Local sourcing / Fair-trade / Organic / Bio-degradable / Low carbon / Fair employment practises etc.

Other ideas being considered include:-

Farmers Market, Crop Swap and a Public Event to raise awareness and share ideas. We welcome input from members of the public.

FINANCIAL INCREASES—REASONING FOR 2020/21

For the 2020/21 Financial Year, the Kingsteignton Town Council Finance Committee approved an increase of 2.5% to the Annual Precept. This is the amount due to the Kingsteignton Town Council from their section of the Teignbridge Council Tax Bill.

The reasoning for this increase is to keep up with inflation and to ensure enough funds are available in order to maintain our current programme of improvements and the taking over of further services being devolved down to our level, the Town Council felt this was the minimum level of increase that could be made.

The effect of this will raise the annual amount due per Band D Household from £57.54 to £58.98 which is an increase of £1.44 per year or approximately £0.03p per week. This increase will help defray some of the costs created by the Town Council's continued endeavour to provide first class amenities at the Community Hall. Last year's programme saw further improvements including the installation of an air conditioning system at the Community Hall.

In the Town we have carried out improvement works at the Fountain, installed CCTV at Oakford Lawn and at Clifford Park , a Skatepark ramp and _other games equipment at Clifford Park and created a landing area for the Devon Air Ambulance. We have again retained a part-time contractor to maintain the clearance of the Leats' and Pathways etc.

The Town Council will continue to actively look at ways to improve the facilities in Kingsteignton with projects like Bus Shelters, Dog & Waste Bin sites, Notice Boards and Seating continuing to need attention.

They also hope to work more closely with both Teignbridge District and Devon County Councils to try and improve those areas where they have no jurisdiction, i.e. Roads, Waterways, Footpaths etc. Work is ongoing with regards to participation in the Devon County Council Road Warden Scheme during 2020.

Whilst Kingsleigh Park and Priscott Way Park are Teignbridge District Council owned parks, they are in our Town, so may we please ask you to comply with the Government guidelines by not using the play equipment. It is believed that the virus can live on some surfaces for up to several days, so if somebody who is infected (who may not be aware that they have it), has touched that surface, it could be passed on to you or your children.

It is also recommended to use a tissue or a glove to lift the lid of the Dog Waste Bin and then dispose of the tissue in a separate open bin afterwards.

SUCCESS OF MENTAL HEALTH ROADSHOW AT THE PASSAGE HOUSE HOTEL

Residents of all ages from Kingsteignton and neighbouring areas attended the Mental Health Roadshow back in November 2019 held at the Passage House Hotel. Speakers from several organisations supported the event by making presentations to well attended audiences and by having information available at their stalls. Advice was given on how to recognise issues in those around us, symptoms to look out for, how to obtain help and information, who to contact and most of all to promote to all, that we all need to be more kind and caring to others, offer support, listen to those suffering and let them know that they are not alone. It's ok to talk about it. There is always somebody somewhere who can help.

Mental health issues can happen to anybody at any time. It can be brought on by something minor but can easily grow into

a major issue. The sooner people seek help, the sooner the issue can be addressed, with the problem usually becoming smaller and hopefully within time being solved. Sharing a problem makes it less of a burden.

The event was put on by Kingsteignton Town Council working in collaboration

with Kingsteignton charity, KingsCare, in support of the #DoltForDeaks campaign, set up in memory of Kyle Deakin, one of the teenagers who sadly lost his life to this awful illness back in 2018.

Officially opened by Mayor, Cllr Dave Rollason, the event got underway with Kyles' Mum, Yo, speaking of the importance of being able to talk with family members, especially teenagers who tend to hide away and even young children who can have issues. Following the loss of her son Kyle, Yo, does not want anybody else to have to deal with the grief that she and her family have, so is supporting the campaign led by KingsCare. Maggie Bonnell heads up the charity and spoke of the work they are doing in order to support a growing population needing the services

they offer through mental health support worker Briony. It is also their intention to take on a further mental health support worker within the near future.

Young people in particular often get caught up within social media issues that can escalate within minutes,

leading on to devasting consequences. Debt is a major issue to many people of today but there are organisations who can help. Men are not exempt from mental health issues either and a great place to start is by popping along to informal group, Andys Man Club, who meet every Monday at 7pm at Coffee #1 in Newton Abbot (except Bank Holidays).

We would like to thank The Passage House Hotel for very kindly allowing us to put this event on and for providing hot drink facilities all without any charges. Our thanks also go to all of the

organisations

and companies who so generously donated fantastic prizes for the raffle which raised over £2,000 funding, which will help with the running of the Mental Health Support Services offered by KingsCare. Thank you also to all of the organisations who supported the event with stalls and information. Last but not least, 'Thank You' to all who attended the event and we hope that it has been helpful.






LOOKING BACK AT DECEMBER IN KINGSTEIGNTON!


