#### **New Gates Installed**



#### FREE TREE GIVEAWAY

#### Residents received 'free trees' in support of DWT's 'Saving Devon's Treescapes' project!

A total of 195 tree whips were given away free of charge to residents who visited The Fountain on Saturday 5th February 2022. Working in partnership with Devon Wildlife Trust, Kingsteignton Town Council set up a stall and residents queued up to collect one or two free trees to plant either in their own gardens or on land which they had permission to do so.



A variety of native species offered on the day, included Oak, Crab Apple, Wild Cherry, Rowan, Birch, Hawthorn, Hazel and Willow. These were handed out along with tree guards, supports, planting guides and aftercare information, by Kingsteignton Town Councillors' Beryl Austen, Martin Field and Ron Peart, Mayor, as well as KTC's Deputy Clerk, Michelle Lewis-Clarke.

Residents were asked to complete a pledge card so that we can see where the trees are being planted and check in to see how they are growing.

Our sincere thanks go to all who visited and took away tree whips. We look forward to seeing how well they grow. The Town Council may hopefully be able to run another event like this towards the end of the year. The best time to plant trees is between October to March and it would be lovely to see more trees being planted within Kingsteignton gardens in order to help protect our wildlife and environment.


#### CLLR IMOGEN LAWS

Under the Public Space Protection Order, you are required to clean up after your dog and keep them under control, for the wellbeing and enjoyment of yourself, your dog, and others.

To make the most out of your walks, we ask you to respect the space, and others, by:



Keeping your dogs on leads when next to roads, on shared routes such as cycle paths, public bridleways, and when asked to by a dog warden.



Walking no more than six dogs at once - and keeping them all under control.



Paying attention to what your dog is doing at all times.



Keeping your dog out of restricted areas, such as play parks, and beaches during the summer.



Carrying bags, poop scoops, and other equipment for if your dog fouls.



Picking up after your dog if it fouls, and disposing of waste in a dog bin or a normal bin.

#### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

I would like to thank our residents for their support of the 'Free Tree Giveaway' event held at The Fountain on Saturday 5th February. Working in partnership with Devon Wildlife Trust, this was part of a scheme called Saving Devon's Tree Scapes. Town Councillors' and Staff were kept busy giving out trees. We had a great response from residents who came along to pick up their free trees together with a mix of spirals and wooden stakes to protect the trees. I will see if the Town Council could do this again at the end of this year.

I have good news regarding the upgrade of Clifford Park, we can go ahead with plans for Phase 2 which will increase the size of the area for younger children with more equipment. Funding for this project was agreed by Viridor Credits Environment Company and I am delighted to share with you that we were

awarded £72,632 towards this project, with the balance of the funding coming from S106 and Kingsteignton Town Council, who will provide the rest from CIL, a tax from developers. The full cost for upgrade will be £109,000. We have already completed Phase I with a new skate ramp and CCTV that is monitored by Newton Abbot Security Trust, along with the rest of our CCTV in Kingsteignton. Kingsteignton Town Council are the owners of Clifford Park and we will always do our best to improve the park for everyone to enjoy.

It is good to see the daffodils as you enter our Town, the first sign of spring is on the way. Keep safe, Cllr Row Peart, Mayor
