MAKE A CHANGE BECOME A KINGSTEIGNTON TOWN COUNCILLOR

WHAT DO LOCAL COUNCILS DO?

Your local council has overall responsibility for the wellbeing of your local community. Their work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- Improve quality of life for residents
- Give communities a democratic voice

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Councillors are community leaders and represent the interests of the communities they serve.

Local councillors have three main responsibilities:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

GETTING ELECTED

To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union;
- At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.

Here's what some of our existing town councillors' have to say:

I am Bill Thorne and after more than a decade as a Kingsteignton Town Councillor and two challenging terms as a Teignbridge District Councillor for the Kingsteignton West Ward I have learnt a lot about what the role of a councillor must include, what it could include and then, perhaps, what it should include.

Everyone imagines what it should include and how it should help them overcome any local problem, come what may and many benefit from what it could include by the councillor assisting with issues beyond their normal responsibilities and working with other councillors and council officers to try to influence the delivery of suitable solutions.

Of course, I have enjoyed the years of meeting residents, listening to their issues, agreeing courses of action, involving others where required to deliver on their issues or influence the Council's decisions through making a case for the council to consider. Everyone benefits from an open and honest approach and transparency in all activities of both the councillor and the council. This is something of what the role must include as I see it.

At all times there are the basic requirements of scrutiny, through asking questions in council often after a massive amount of personal research to see that the rules, also agreed by the council, are being followed correctly for the benefit of residents.

Sadly, as we all know, there is never enough money to do all everyone needs or wants and this is where the councillor needs to know the ward and what on balance might suit those residents and then the rest of the council area for the better, going forward, whilst considering fellow councillors' opinions throughout before the final decisions are made.

It is an interesting and challenging role at whatever level to take on and one that requires your real commitment and deep interest in helping others within the community.

KINGSTEIGNTON SWIMMING POOL

2022 was a mixed year for the pool. It was wonderful to be able to open our doors again to customers old and new following the closure during the pandemic, which led to restricted swimming when we opened in 2021. We were blessed with a wonderful summer weather wise and it has been great to see schools returning for swimming lessons, our own swimming lessons and sessions for all ages and abilities of swimmers return. We were also pleased to welcome back the regular Kingscare sessions. The local community have again provided us with some wonderful support, both through fundraising and also practical help such as electrical testing, repairing broken doors and providing new signage. Lin Brewer and her team of helpers continue to support the

pool by running Bingo sessions at the Royal British Legion on the third Tuesday of every month at 7.30pm. We also had a fun day at the pool for the first time with Olympic Gold Medallist Calum Jarvis as our special guest. This raised over £800 as well as raising our profile.

The bad news is that like everyone else, we are facing unprecedented challenges regarding our utility bills which have risen beyond belief in 2022 and this year predicted to be more than £68,000. A huge increase on our usual £14/15,000 per season. At time of writing, the committee are looking at quotes for alternative heat sources and how to get grants to pay for the capital costs of these in an attempt to save the pool from closure. The swimming pool is an immensely valuable resource for everyone in Kingsteignton and we are determined to do everything we can to keep it open. If anyone is able to undertake some fundraising for us or join us in the fight

to keep the pool open please contact us on info@kingsteigntonswimmingpool.org.uk

January 2023: We have just submitted an application for a grant to Valencia for £100,000 to allow us to install air source heat pumps and buy a new thermal cover in an attempt to reduce our utility bills and reduce our reliance on fossil fuels. We have to fundraise 10% i.e. £10,000, which over 2022 we managed to do.

Thank you to everyone who has helped make this possible. We are doing all we can to save the pool from closure. Please keep fingers and toes crossed for us.

KINGSTEIGNTON FREE TREE GIVEAWAY

On Saturday 11th February 2023, Kingsteignton Town Councillors and staff handed out free tree whips to all who came along, to plant in their gardens. A wide variety of UK broadleaf species included Alder, Crab Apple, Elder, Wild Cherry, Rowan, Silver Birch, Hawthorn, Hazel, small leafed Lime tree whips and Holly were handed out along with tree protection guards, planting and aftercare guides, also packs of wild flower seeds.

The event, held for a second year, is run in collaboration with Devon Wildlife Trust to promote their 'Saving Devon's Treescapes' project. Devon is sadly losing thousands of Ash trees due to the Ash dieback disease and it is important that we plant replacements in areas all over the Devon landscape to encourage wildlife and promote air quality.







Recipients of the free tree whips signed a pledge to plant their tree in a suitable location to allow for it's continued growth through the coming years and to agree to photographs and follow ups being made to ensure that they are not wasted.

Devon communities will work together to promote a healthier environment for all who reside and visit the county.
