### Please support your community by keeping your hedges and trees tidy

At the Council Offices we receive several calls throughout the year about overhanging trees, hedges, shrubs and weeds.

As an occupant of your property whether you own it or are the tenant, it is your responsibility to make sure that trees, hedges and other vegetation growing on your land do not cause a safety concern or obstruction for users of the public highway. Even if the overgrowth is the other side of your fence onto a public highway you are still liable to keep it clear.

In the event of overgrowth being reported to Devon County Council, you will receive a letter giving you two weeks notice to take action to clear it and in the event that this is not adhered to, Highways will arrange for the work to be done by themselves or a contractor and then the expenses will be incurred by yourself.

Should you be unable to clear the vegetation then the Council will do their utmost to assist in some way. When undertaking any clearance of hedges etc, please be aware of regulations in respect of wildlife.

- We are arranging for the lane leading to Oakford Lawn to be tarmacked, between Redmaynes Accountants and Abbey Stationers. The Town Council are arranging for this work as a gesture of goodwill to improve the entrance through to Oakford Lawn.
- We are looking to tidy up The Fountain area
- Upgrading of Clifford Park
- To provide a night time landing site for Devon Air Ambulance, this is still ongoing

### Check who you pay to take your rubbish away'

Did you know that you are legally responsible for the waste you are getting rid of? This means that if it ends up getting dumped you could face a fine and a criminal record.

Don't become a victim of this type of crime. Before you pay someone to take your old fridge, furniture or bulky items away, follow our simple checklist:

- Check if they have a waste carriers licence. You
  can do this by checking on their website, asking to
  see their waste carriers licence and by calling the
  Environment Agency on 03708 506 506 for a free
  instant waste carrier check.
- Make a record. Take a note or photograph of the registration number of the vehicle that is being used to take your waste away and ask where it will end up
- Get a receipt. Ensure that you get a transfer notice or receipt before your waste is taken away

Remember that most unwanted bulky household items can be taken to your nearest recycling centre for free. Alternatively Teignbridge Council provide a free rural skip service and offer a charged bulky waste collection service.
