The facilities are accessible for wheelchair users and are suitable for use by adults as well as children and young people.






2 meeting rooms are available (seating 14/28)

PLEASE KEEP YOUR HEDGES, TREES AND OVERGROWTH TIDY

Please be advised that as an occupant of your property whether you own it or are the tenant, it is your responsibility to make sure that trees, hedges and other vegetation growing on your land do not cause a safety concern or obstruction for users of the public highway. Even if the overgrowth is the other side of your fence onto a public highway you are still liable to keep it clear.

In the event of overgrowth being reported to Devon County Council, you will receive a letter giving you two weeks notice to take action to clear it and in the event that this is not adhered to, Highways will arrange for the work to be done by themselves or by a contractor and then the expenses will be charged on to you. Should you be unable to clear the vegetation then the Council will do their utmost to assist in some way.



DOG OWNERS, PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOU DOG AND USE THE BINS!

Dog owners please be responsible and pick up your dogs waste, it really isn't pleasant to see or step in!

Just think if a small toddler or anybody else fell in some dog poo, it can have catastrophic consequences which can even result in death. In and around Kingsteignton we have several dog waste and normal bins which you can put dog waste in (as long as it is in a bag). We urge you to please use them, even in the parks.

FINANCIAL INCREASES REASONING FOR 2019/20

For the 2019/20 Financial Year, the Finance Committee initially recommended that, with the UK inflation rate running at 2%, the Town Council approve an increase suitable to take account of inflation when making a decision on the annual Precept. This is the amount due to Kingsteignton Town Council from their section of the Teignbridge Council Tax Bill.

Unfortunately the Government have seen fit to remove the section of all Council's income known as the Council Tax Support Grant. Last year this was valued at £15,820.

In order to maintain our current programme of improvements and the taking on of the additional services being devolved down to our level, the Town Council felt that it could ill afford the loss of this Grant and should recoup it from the Precept.

The effect of this will raise the annual amount due per Band D Household from £52.31 to £57.54 which is an increase of £5.23p per year or approximately £0:10p per week.

This increase will help defray some of the costs created by the Town Council's endeavour to continue to provide first class amenities at the Community Hall. Last year's programme saw completion of the much needed replacement of the Hall Floor and selection of the Contractor for the refurbishment of the Toilet facilities.

In the Town we completed the History Garden and the new footpath in Oakford Lawn, re-surfacing of Oakford Lane was completed and we commenced restoration of the Higher Leat at Crossley Moor Road to it's former glory. Ongoing work on this area will be the re-building of the retaining wall bordering Crossley Moor Road and the de-silting and bank restoration from Longford Lane to the Higher Mill.

We have retained a part time contractor to maintain the clearance of the Leats and hope to include some of the footpaths in the coming year. We would like to thank Mr Rob May for doing a such great job, it really is making

As always, the Town Council will continue to actively look at ways to improve the facilities in Kingsteignton with projects like Bus Shelters, Dog & Waste Bin sites, Notice Boards and Seating which continue to need attention. We currently have 6 new Waste Bins waiting to be installed once ground conditions improve.



We also hope to work more closely with both Teignbridge District and Devon County Councils to try and improve those areas where we currently have no jurisdiction, i.e. Roads, Waterways, Footpaths etc. and will be actively looking at taking part in the Devon County Council Road Warden Scheme during 2019.

PATHWAY WALKERS — VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Do you like walking the rural pathways of Kingsteignton? — maybe you walk a dog? Or maybe you just enjoy walking for a bit of fresh air and exercise?

EVER THOUGHT OF TAKING UP A NEW ACTIVITY?

Linda & Ron were persuaded to join our club in 2013 and Bowls has given them both a new lease of life. Linda being naturally introverted was virtually house bound and was agoraphobic. Ron has had physical difficulties and they are both diabetic. In Linda's own words: 'Bowls has saved my life!' She admits to previous psychological problems and hasn't look back since.

Barring schedule matches, we have afternoon 'roll ups' (practice games) every week day. The green has an all weather carpet and, weather permitting, bowls can be played 12 months of the year. All weather surfaces are easier to bowl on than grass in the U.K. and not so much 'heave' is required. From April - September, the club has prearranged friendly mixed matches against other local clubs, which are very social and played in good spirit. Wednesday morning, in the Summer, the men's Over 55's matches are played. There is a Ladies South Devon Bowls League played on various days through the Summer. Kingsteignton ladies traditionally play well against local clubs. All of the prearranged club matches are played home and away.

For those bowlers with experience and of a competitive nature, there is The Mid Devon League. Again, this is a series of Summer matches, played home and away. Kingsteignton Bowling Club, often play against county and England bowlers, of which Devon has its fair share. Although played in good spirit, these matches are more serious as the standard is higher than the other leagues we are involved with. On fine Summer evenings during home games, club members come down to view a high standard of bowls.

Club bowls at Kingsteignton, then, can be as light hearted or as competitive as the player wishes. It's a great way to meet people and make new friends. We welcome new members at any time, so please, even if you are on your own, do come and give it a go!
