KINGSTEIGNTON ANNUAL TOWN MEETING 2022

Our Mayor Councillor Ron Peart, welcomed residents' and local club and organisation representatives to the Annual Town Meeting, held on Friday 22nd April at 6 pm at The Community Hall, Rydon Road.

The Mayor's presentation explained the actions and work that had been undertaken in and around the Town over the past two years. Cllr Peart, Chair of the Works, Services and Planning Committee, said necessary works had continued to be carried out and as Consultees the Town Council had responded to Teignbridge District Council on planning matters. Cllr Peart explained that work continued throughout the pandemic with all staff either working from home or in the office and Council meetings being held virtually prior to restrictions being eased. Last Summer, when permitted, meetings were held at The Community Hall under strict guidelines. Maintenance staff continued working within the areas that were permitted under the restrictions. He expressed his thanks to all concerned as well as his fellow Councillors who have continued to provide their services.

Councillor Ron Peart, read a report on behalf of the Finance Chairman, Councillor Bill Thorne.

Councillor Julie Scagell, Chair of the Community Hall and Recreation Committee gave a report on the work carried out by this committee. This included maintenance and cleaning up of graffiti at Oakford Lawn and Clifford Park and maintaining the Community Hall for safe use by Tiny Toes Pre-School, the Kingsteignton Community Baptist Church and latterly, other hirers.

Councillor Ron Peart presented grants to local organisations and clubs (listed below), awarding them with funding to allow them to make beneficial improvements to their groups and members, some of which will be purchasing new equipment, used for structural improvements and being able to provide activities or events.

Kingsteignton Swimming Pool, Teign School Farm, Kingsteignton Youth Club, 1st Newton Abbot Sea Scouts (Kingsteignton), Stover Canal, Kingsteignton Allotments, South Devon Aspergers, WBB Youth Football Club and Rackerhayes Pre School.

Presentations of Citizenship Awards were also made by Councillor Ron Peart, to residents of the Town who have worked tirelessly as volunteers to improve the lives of others. These included Mrs Margaret and Mr Graham Lucas for their work with KingsCare, Ms Yolanda Hodge for her work for #DoltForDeaks Charity, and Dave Rollason for his work with Kingsteignton Youth Centre. Bill Beech has also received an award but was not present and a Posthumous award for Mrs Becky Filby.

Residents in attendance were asked by Councillor Ron Peart, if they had any issues that they wished to raise. One question raised was also asked by a resident in writing prior to the meeting, concerning the new foot bridge that had been built over the River Teign on the approach to Teigngrace.

Councillor Ron Peart, as Devon County Councillor, advised that there is currently an issue with the specification of its build, as it does not currently meet Devon County Councils specification requirements'. Therefore, they will not adopt the bridge at the moment and await for it to be rectified. The bridge will be kept closed at present, in order to meet safety requirements for the publics' sake.

Residents raised questions about the new Traffic Calming on Broadway Road. County Councillor, Ron Peart explained that it needs to be in place for 12 months before any issues are considered by Devon County Council. Residents were asked to make their complaints directly to DCC.

Cllr Peart is hoping that he will be able to hold the Mayor's Annual Civic Carol Service this coming December, after not having one for the past two years due to the Covid restrictions and safe distancing for dignitaries and our residents.

Kingsteignton Town Council Precept 2022-2023

As everyone will be aware, the cost of virtually everything is going up with annual inflation as of March 2022 standing at 7%.

The Finance Committee, having considered the Budget prepared for the year ended 31 March 2023, recommended an increase of 5% in the precept. This increase was agreed at a meeting of the Full Council on 5 January 2022.

The 5% increase actually covers two years, there having been no increase in the rate payable last year.

The annual amount due for a Band D household rises from £58.98 to £61.93, an increase of £2.95 for the year or just under £0.06 per week.

The increase is necessary to ensure that projected costs are fully covered by anticipated income for the year - with income from other sources being down but gradually improving, compared with pre COVID levels.

The Council will continue to seek to provide first class amenities at the Community Hall and to look at ways of improving the facilities in Kingsteignton.

During the year ahead we will be undertaking considerable improvement works to the facilities provided at Clifford Park.

As in the past, we will look to continue to work closely with Teignbridge District and Devon County Councils to improve those areas where we have no jurisdiction ie. Roads, Footpaths, Waterways etc.

CLIFFORD PARK UPDATE

On Monday 23rd May 2022, work started on the removal and installation of new equipment within the childrens' play area. This work is expected to be completed within 4-6 weeks. Please accept our apologies for any inconvenience caused whilst this work is carried out.

Whilst the existing swings will be kept and revamped, the new equipment will include an inclusive 'wok roundabout' a 'pod swing' and a wheelchair accessible roundabout, as well as ~ new 'springers' a 'hammock swing', 2 trampolines, a 'hip hop', a fixed train, a 'double perch', a metal 'rope-end swing' and a 'multi play unit'!

SAD PASSING OF TWO FORMER KINGSTEIGNTON COUNCILLORS

It with great sadness that we have recently heard of the passing of two former Parish/Town Councillors, Becky Filby and Babs Errington. Both were well respected members of the community and will be missed by many. Our condolences go to family and friends of both Becky and Babs.

Mrs Becky Filby

Becky had been suffering from Alzheimer's for some time and sadly passed away in April. Becky will have been known to many for her involvement with the Library over many years. Becky was a Councillor from September 1999 until 2006 and was an active member of the Parish Council.

Mrs Babs Errington

Babs was a long serving councillor for Kingsteignton who resigned in 2011 due to ill health and then re-joined for a short while before resigning again. Babs was very well known to the community as she used to run the Luncheon Club on a Wednesday at the Community Hall and spent many an hour, making and baking lunches and desserts for community members. Babs was also a very keen artist. After battling through long term illness for some time, Babs sadly passed away in May at the remarkable age of 97.



The first event held by the "Kingsteignton Wild" group, was held at 4pm on the 8th May in the grounds of the Community Hall in Rvdon Road.






A wide variety of nature tables were arranged, offering creative, but also simple ways that everyone can enhance their own spaces at home to encourage nature.

'SWIFT' ~ Letter received from St. Michael's School Children

Dear Sir/Madam,

As a Rights Respecting School, we have been learning about Article 24, which says that we have the right to a clean, healthy and happy environment. We therefore want to protect our environment for the future. We are writing to ask if the council are able to help with supplying more swift boxes in our area or protecting the homes of the swift population living in St Michael's Church and surrounding area. Please can we have more swift boxes, we don't want to see the lovely swifts in our area going extinct.

Swifts are in danger because they are losing their cosy, warm homes, food and water. Swifts often live in the rooves of people's houses. Their homes are disappearing because people block them off when they fix their rooves. This is bad because swifts will try over and over again to get their nests back and will eventually die trying even if they can't get to it.

Swifts are brilliant creatures because they help look after the environment. They keep insect numbers under control so that we are not overwhelmed with irritating insects. They also eat lots of insects that are troublesome to humans like mosquitos and aphids. There is a problem though- there are less and less insects than there used to be because humans are damaging their habitats and building on areas where they would thrive. This is the swift's main source of food- they can collect up to 1000 insects at a time when feeding their babies so we must do more to help.

We don't want swifts to become extinct because they have been around since the dinosaurs- 65 million years ago (around the time when Tyrannosaurus Rex became extinct). During this time, nothing about the swifts has changed except where they live. They used to nest in rocky caves and high trees, now they nest under the boards and rooves of houses. They made this change because we have been cutting down trees and blocking caves so that we can have more room for houses. This makes it harder for swifts to nest and causes more problems when they want to come back to the same nests every year. We don't think it is fair that the swifts' homes are being damaged for our houses.

We can help solve this problem though by building more swift boxes high up so that the swifts can return every summer. We can build more ponds in our area, let grass grow longer and plant more flowers to provide the swifts with food, water and plenty of insects so they can nest, breed and live alongside humans. This would mean we would have more cute chicks and families of swifts will keep going for hundreds of years from now.

We know you can help, there are already lots of swifts living peacefully in St Michael's Church and we want to encourage more to our area. We look forward to seeing what you write to us.
