
At the Annual Meeting of the Town Council held on Wednesday 1st May at the Community Hall, Kingsteignton, Councillors re-elected Councillor Ron Peart as Mayor and elected Councillor Julie Scagell as Deputy Mayor. Both will serve their community for the next term of office from May 1st 2024 until April 30th 2025.

Mayor, Councillor Ron Peart has served six previous terms between 2016-2019 and 2021-2024 and Deputy Mayor, Councillor Julie Scagell has previously fulfilled the role of Deputy Mayor for two terms of office between 2019/2021. Retiring Deputy Mayor, Councillor Bill Thorne did the honours of graciously handing over the Deputy Mayor's Chain to Councillor Julie Scagell.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

On Friday 17th May Kingsteignton Town Council held their Annual Town meeting. This event was a chance for residents of the town to catch up on achievements and work that councillors and staff have carried out during the last 12 months.

Presentations to the public explaining what has happened over the past year. I started the presentation with an overview of events including King Charles III's Coronation event on 6th May 2023 held in the grounds of the town council building and main hall.



I covered many other events that had taken place and work our outside staff had done keeping the town looking well kept. It was then the turn of other councillors to explain what they do at their committees they chair.

It was then time to give out Kingsteignton Town Council annual grants to the successful clubs and organisations who applied. Each one received a cheque for their projects, this will benefit their members and the community of Kingsteignton.

My next duty was to award the Kingsteignton Citizenship Award. This year I presented the award to Jeanne Langridge who was nominated by a former Girl Guide. Jeanne has volunteered for over 37 years with Kingsteignton Girl Guides. It was a great pleasure to give Jeanne her framed certificate and orchid.

Our final part of the evening was an opportunity for residents to raise local concerns or queries and this led to some actions for councillors to look into. The evening ended with refreshments.

June and I were invited to attend Kingsteignton Ram Roasting Fair, this took place at the town's Oakford Lawn on the 27th May. Town Crier, Jackie Edwards, officially opened the fair and despite the occasional shower, visitors flocked to this annual charity event. I was happy to crown the May Queen as Mayor of Kingsteignton. Crowds were entertained by traditional maypole dancing from local youngsters.

The day offered many attractions and on behalf of the town council I would like to thank everyone involved for organising this event for our town.

Our final event was on Saturday 1st June, Kingsteignton's very first town crier competition. Criers from across the country attended this competition organised by Kingsteignton Town Council. June and I had a great day along with members of the public. I would like to thank our town crier, Jackie Edwards and all the other town criers who travelled to take part in this event and all involved.

I am pleased that we will be holding a new Community Festival event on Saturday 10th August at the Community Hall and grounds, this will be similar to our event held last year for the King's Coronation. Entry will be free and there will be live music from Roger Styles, Pure Diamond and The Liberty Sisters in the marquee. There will be plenty of childrens entertainment and activities. A licensed bar and food stalls will also be available.

On Sunday 10th November, my wife June and I will join the Royal British Legion's Remembrance Parade through the town to St. Michael's Church and the War Memorial in Sandpath Road. It is hoped that many residents will also mark their respects by either watching the passing parade or by joining us at the War Memorial.



I have once again selected "Walking Alongside" KingsCare Mental Health Charity as the Mayor's Charity.

These vital funds help towards meeting the increased demand for mental health services offered by KingsCare.

Just prior to the end of my mayoral term 2023 – 2024, on Tuesday 30th April 2024, I presented the Mayor's charity cheque to the value of £131.98 to Maggie Bonnell for the "Walking Alongside" KingsCare Mental Health Charity. Funds raised had been collected from the Mayor's Civic Carol Service which was held on Friday 8th December 2023.

COMMUNITY HALL/RECREATION COMMITTEE

The recreational spaces that we are responsible for include Oakford Lawn, Clifford Park, Cottey Meadow and the delightful Kindle Corner. All these areas are kept clear, clean and safe for all to enjoy.

All the areas of The Community Hall come under this committee, the interior and exterior of the space.

The Kingsteignton in Bloom Competition is going from strength to strength, we are adding a new category for the forthcoming year—Best Wildlife Garden, good luck to all entering!

We re-named the quiet garden at Oakford Lawn to be the Family Garden to encourage more usage. A budget has been set to plant this area. A discussion has taken place to put in some solar lighting at the Sorrell Court end of Oakford Lawn.

The Carols Around the Tree, is a smashing yearly event that is growing in popularity. This year we had the Bubble House for Santa and his Elf which was queued around the hall. We have also increased the Christmas lights around the town and hope residents and visitors enjoyed them.

Another agreement was made to purchase new cooking equipment for the kitchen, this will make cooking and preparing meals more enjoyable when the kitchen is hired out.

Our Assistant to the Clerk and Events Officer, Bex Hooper, has got stuck in to her role and is doing a marvellous job, having just recently run a Spring Community Litter Pick, which was quite a logistical event to organise. It was very well attended and Teignbridge District Council took 25 bags of rubbish away.

This year the Facilities Maintenance Team have had their hours increased, with the town expanding, we must also grow.

It was agreed and budgeted the Facilities Maintenance Officers will be re-decorating the community hall during the school summer holidays and we have new curtains on order for this room which are also being fitted then, in order to minimise disturbance to Tiny Toes Pre-School and other lettings.

Additionally agreed was the decision to enable our Town Crier to host the first Kingsteignton Town Crier competition, on Saturday 1st June. Jackie Edwards has been our Crier for over 8 years and we are very proud of her.

I hope you will agree with me in saying that all Kingsteignton Town Council staff do an exemplary job and are constantly going above and beyond. If you have any questions about this committee, please speak to me.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

When the finance committee meetings are held, our purpose is to discuss the relevant matters on the prepared agenda and then vote and decide on the various action points. The occurrence of these finance meetings is currently bi-monthly.

In the Autumn our Responsible Finance Officer Mr Philip Banner, produces the draft income and expenditure documents and from this information, the council precept is set by our committee. The setting of the precept is important part of the finance committee's responsibility as the precept can only be set against the expected cost analysis for the year.

For the accurate assessment of the budget, for the year to be evaluated correctly, the full cost of everything our council is responsible for, is documented. However, to enable the town to be at its best, we currently undertake some items that are not strictly our responsibility. One example would be the clearing of footpaths and surrounding verges and leats by our own Facilities Maintenance Officers.

In April the main item on the meeting agenda is to discuss and approve the community grant applications. It is with great pleasure that we approve these applications to our local clubs and organisations, who make this town a great community to be a part of. The council always support the swimming pool and the youth centre as standard. Other clubs and organisations are welcome to apply also and do so in many numbers. We know these grants are very welcomed and treasured.

The current team of seven finance committee members are always aligned in their collective responsibility and are very committed, which ensures stability. Our intention is always to maintain these high standards now and in the future.


WORKS, SERVICES AND PLANNING COMMITTEE

Please may we remind our residents that hedges should not be cut back during the nesting season which typically runs from February until August, it is therefore preferable that you refrain from cutting back until after July 31st. However, there are certain circumstances such as for visibility/access reasons that it is deemed necessary and is therefore acceptable but please check for bird nests prior to proceeding and if they are present, please do not disturb.

We also ask that should you have hedges or trees which overhang the public highways or neighbours properties that you keep your vegetation tidy please.
