Community Speed Watch Update

Since the previous report the team have had one speed watch session. This was during the week of 17th-23rd November 2024, which was National Road Safety Week. During this week, across Devon and Cornwall 647 vehicles were reported for speeding, 54 groups across the area took part with 78 roadside sessions completed. Throughout the two counties the mean percentage of drivers speeding was 4%. In Kingsteignton the percentage of drivers speeding was 14.5%, indicating that we have a continuing issue with speeding in our town.

Cllr Tillson-Hawke received a request for CSW to be considered at Chudleigh Road. Cllr Tillson-Hawke agreed to investigate the feasibility of a site with D&C Police via the appropriate procedure. Members were also advised approval had been given from Devon Highways to allow a Vehicle Activated Sign to be placed on the B3195. Officers will work with Cllr Tillson-Hawke to bring this to fruition as soon as practicable.

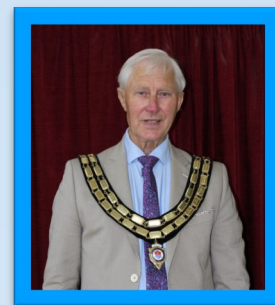

OPENING 18TH APRIL

Our lovely swimming pool is entering its 46th year and last year saw some changes that you may have noticed. Thanks to a grant from Sport England new thermal covers were installed to keep the heat in and save energy. The grant also covered the installation of solar panels on the pool roof. Despite the poor weather last summer, the pool managed to survive the season, mainly due to the amount of schools that now use the wonderful facilities for their swimming lessons. Kingscote and Newton Abbot Swimming & Water Polo Club also have regular bookings. The pool Trustees were also delighted to obtain small grants to provide free swims for children and adults with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities. This proved to be very popular and is on the timetable again for 2025. The Trustees are very aware of the financial restraints that everyone is under so have decided not to raise any of our public swimming session costs and if you are over 80 you can swim for free! (T&C's apply). Work has been carried out throughout the winter with a new flat roof on the storeroom, new fire alarm systems and hopefully a new outdoor shower will be in place by opening day. Various local groups have supported the pool this year including the Senior Citizens Club who presented the pool with a cheque for £1,000 in December from their tabletop sale. Lin Brewer who runs the Swimming Pool Bingo raised an outstanding £3,600 in 2024.

If you know the pool you will have seen the red benches which were installed in 1988. These are badly in need of refurbishment. If you would like a lasting memory of your fun times at the pool, the Trustees are inviting local people and businesses to 'sponsor a bench', which will cost £200 and include a plaque with your family or business name on. Hopefully this will ensure they last for another 37 years. Someone who has already signed up is Sarah Whitmore whose parents sponsored an original bench in memory of her brother, Jeremy King, many of you may remember was sadly killed in 1973 at the age of 8 as the result of a tragic accident. Sarah says 'for me and my family it is important to keep Jeremy's memory alive and sponsoring the refurbishment of the bench and plaque in his memory is a lovely way to do so. 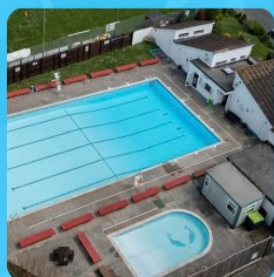

SPRINGTIME ...

LET'S ALL ENJOY GETTING OUTSIDE AND TIDYING OUR GARDENS!

Upon approaching our town in recent weeks, the beautiful daffodils have been dancing in the breeze amongst our grass verges, a delight as Springtime approaches giving us all a glimmer of hope as longer daylight hours and some warmth is on the horizon, something I think we are all looking forward to after the long dull grey days that we have experienced recently!

It's that time of year where we can get outside, albeit in our wellington boots maybe and start tidying our gardens. Pruning shrubs, cutting hedges back prior to the nesting season commencing and do some moss removal and aerating the lawns to improve nutrients and drainage. Removing weeds from our borders now, will lessen the burden of their roots taking hold and getting deeper. After the extreme winds and torrential rain, there are likely to be an exceptional amount of hanging branches and debris that need clearing in preparation for the months ahead.

If you live in a property without a garden then maybe you could think about having a window box or hanging basket, all will enhance ones well-being as well as benefitting the environment.

You may even be planning to create a new look for your garden, plant some shrubs before the soil becomes too warm but also being cautious of any late frosts (remember fleece can be purchased from your local garden centre or DIY store) to protect them if necessary. Flower pots, containers and hanging baskets should be cleaned out prior to planting up in the coming months, preparation is key to being ready when the time is right for the planting of bedding plants etc.



HEDGING, TREES AND OVERGROWTH ADVICE

Please be advised that as a property owner, it is your responsibility to make sure that trees, hedges and other vegetation growing on or from the boundaries of your property, do not cause a safety concern or obstruction for users of the public highway or your neighbours.

In the event of overgrowth being reported to Devon County Council, you will receive a letter giving two weeks notice to take the appropriate action to clear it and in the event that this is not adhered to, Highways will arrange for the work to be done by themselves or by a contractor and you will then be invoiced for the work.

When undertaking any clearance of hedges etc. please be aware and check on current regulation in respect of wildlife that may be inhabiting your garden.

Also, if you have your waste taken away by somebody else, please ensure that you check that the waste company that you are using is licensed to do so. If they aren't licensed and dispose of your waste inappropriately, you may be liable for fly tipping which may result in being fined.

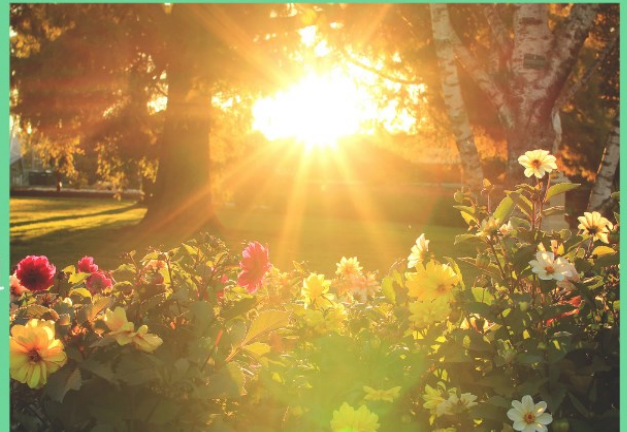

PLEA TO DOG OWNERS IN OUR TOWN—PLEASE BIN IT OR TAKE IT HOME!



In recent months we have received several reports of an increased amount of dog mess on our pavements parks within our town.

It can be exceptionally detrimental to human life, i.e. if a toddler or anybody else who may loose their footing and fall into dog mess, can result in blindness or other catastrophic effects which can even result in death.

Just because it is dark sometimes whilst you walk your dog, there is **'NO EXCUSE'** for leaving the dog mess behind.

All bins, whether they are dog poo bins or general council waste bins either can be used for dog poo bags.

We would however, like to say **'THANK YOU'** to those respectful owners/walkers who do pick up!

TEIGNBRIDGE CURRENT RULES

- ◆ Pick up after your dog in public places.
- ◆ Obey the rules at your local beaches as some places have restricted access at different times of the year.
- ◆ Keep dogs of areas signed as dog exclusion areas (ie. Children's play parks).
- ◆ Keep your dog on a lead in areas where Teignbridge Council signs are indicating that dogs must be on a lead.
- ◆ Keep your dog on a fixed lead (which includes a fixed extendable lead), of no more than 1 metre in length, when on or adjacent to the public highway, a footway, footpath or cycle track.
- ◆ Keep your dog on a lead when directed by an authorised Officer or Police Officer to prevent a nuisance or behaviour by the dog which is likely to cause annoyance or danger to any other person or animal.
- ◆ As an individual, walk a maximum of 6 dogs (this applies to professional dog walkers too).
- ◆ Carry sufficient poo bags or other appropriate means to pick up dog faeces

Please remember that a fine for not picking up your dog's mess can result in an on the spot fixed penalty of £100 or up to £1,000 if it goes to court.

TEIGNBRIDGE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SOCIETY

We are a new archaeological society, with the aim of providing people with the skills to engage with and pursue archaeology as a hobby, interest or career to the fullest of their ability.

We hosted our first lecture by Lee Bray, another DNPA archaeologist on the 17th October 2024. Due to the size of the venue, we were limited on seats with a maximum of 80 being able to attend. During the meeting we asked our new members to write down what they wanted from us as a society.

As anticipated, the majority of responses expressed a desire for practical skills training, ranging from excavation techniques to more specialised areas, in addition to conventional society activities like lectures and guest speakers. It was heartening to see such enthusiasm for archaeology within our community, coupled with a strong preference for actual hands-on engagement and training.

Going forwards, we have many ideas on how to provide practical skills education to our up and coming archaeologists.

Workshops covering integral on-site skills such as section and plan drawings, filling in context sheets, identifying soil types as well as then progressing onto excavation-related activities.

We also have a few contacts who would love to provide their expertise; a geophysicist who has kindly offered to teach certain geophysical methods such as soil resistivity, a metal detectorist who would like to teach people how to detect properly. Other areas we also want to cover are experimental archaeology, field walking and surveying.

We also aim to establish partnerships with various institutions, including museums and universities, to facilitate the knowledge and skill shares among diverse individuals and groups. Additionally, we are keen to explore publications by creating reports from each excavation and providing members with the chance to assist in the production to a professional standard, given that such opportunities are scarce prior to working in a commercial setting.

In developing these skills for individuals who join we hope these members will take their experiences with them and provide a positive impact, whether that is as a volunteer, a student, or as a commercial archaeologist.

We want to make sure that there is as little financial burden on the society members as possible, by balancing our membership costs while still having enough to pay for insurance, equipment, speakers, venues and events.

However, we are just starting out, and some equipment can be quite expensive for a small society to start with. To give our society members the best chance at developing their skillsets for the future, we would like to ask that if any of you have or know of any spare equipment that you would be willing to donate – trowels, mattocks, hand shovels, buckets, permatrace, pencils, cameras, GPS (just to name a few!) – please do get in contact with us.
